What's involved in this task:

How-to: Join a blade painting party

What's involved in this task:

- Taking a steer from our resident blade-painting artist, Geoff T:) there
 are currently c. 12 sets of blades to be painted WEY colours.
- We normally need a couple dry days to sand, prime, paint and decorate each blade, so please set aside some time for this.
- Supplied: blades(!), sanding paper, paint, tape, etc.

How-to: Sort boat shoes and tools

What's involved in this task:

- Spare rowing shoes should be all stored in a large clear box towards the back of the boathouse, far left, but please check elsewhere in the boathouse for any that are misplaced and pop them in the shoe box.
- If any of the shoes are looking particularly ropey, please let our Fleet Manager (<u>fleet@weybridgerowing.club</u>) know.
- Once finished sorting the shoes, please turn your attention to the tools possibly scattered about the boathouse or even in the clubroom - these should be in the boathouse, hanging off the magnetic strips.

How many are needed to help here:

• 1 person – or 2 for the company and extra pair of hands and eyes

What to do next:



How-to: Sort boat bits/parts

What's involved in this task:

- Spare boat parts are generally stored in the back of the boathouse, far left, in the metal cabinet or toolboxes on or under the workbench.
- There is one other location for boat bits, on the wall in a small parts tilting bins store this needs sorting/restocking also, please.
- If it obvious we are low on stock of any particular part or if any storage box/toolbox is damaged, please let our Fleet Manager (<u>fleet@weybridgerowing.club</u>) know.

How many are needed to help here:

• 1 person – or 2 for the company and extra pair of eyes

What to do next:



How-to: Refresh boating cards

What's involved in this task:

- The magnetic boating cards on the boating whiteboard in the boathouse need refreshing/rewriting about once a year
- Any new boating cards should be made up for incoming club or private boats, and also refreshed at least once a year
- The image below shows how the cards should look, i.e. a template of what to note on each card using permanent Sharpie pens (provided), plus nail polish remover for cards that need cleaning up.

How many are needed to help here:

1 to 2 people

What to do next:



How-to: Rejig and relabel riggers

What's involved - rejigging the way we store our riggers:

- Whilst awaiting the go-ahead from Eric (our <u>facilities manager</u>), please mark up your bingo card to say you are interested in helping out here.
- <u>This photo</u> should give you some idea of what we hope to achieve as a better storage solution for our riggers, especially wing riggers, currently falling about on the floor.

What's involved - relabelling:

- Over time those riggers that are not actually attached to their boat have lost their label, or the writing has faded.
- New labels and marker pens will be provided so that fresh labels can be written up and attached, noting, for example, 'Pull Ardour WEY007 2x/-'
- Please work your way through all the sets of riggers, whether attached to the wall of the boathouse or on the floor (see task below for what we hope to achieve for a better storage solution).

How many are needed to help here:

 This is a fairly sizeable task so at least 4 people, including or additionally another 1 to 3 people to then relabel the riggers (labels and marker pens provided).

What to do next:



How-to: Hauling out and washing launches

What's involved - hauling out a launch:

- Before our 3 coaching launches get too grimy they need regular clean that only a
 pressure washer can make light (and fun) work of. About 3 people are needed to
 each launch to haul it from the river onto the pontoon for cleaning.
- Hands on: once each boat is washed, please return it to the river and moor it up.

What's involved - jet washing a launch:

- Between 3 teams of 2 people at least one pressure washer is needed and extension cable to run from the men's changing room – even better if cordless (we ask if you have one at the end).
- Working as a team, get busy with buckets, suds, some powerful hull cleaner and power hosing the interior and exterior.
- Hands on: once each boat is washed, please return it to the river and moor it up.
- For the launch named Jon: wash down and air dry the cover before putting it back on – doing after the launch should give the interior a bit of time to air dry too.
- A lifejacket for launch cleaning duties should be worn properly at all times.

How many are needed to help here:

• 3 to 5 people per launch, 16+ years of age and at least one adult per team.

What to do next:



How-to: Deep clean a fine shell or two

What's involved in this task:

- Despite every boat of course being cleaned inside and out after every outing, our boats, young and old, can pick up that nasty yellow-brown oil stain along the hull.
- The hull cleaner stored at the back of the boathouse makes light work of getting rid of this and any other staining – not only restoring the boat to its original colour and shine but also bring us a sense of 'boat pride'!
- Be sure to use the soft brush provided and wear protective gloves; also at the back of the boathouse.

How many are needed to help here:

• 2 people per boat but just as well to make it a whole crew affair and do a couple other boats whilst on a roll:)

What to do next:





How-to: Launder hi-vis tops

What's involved in this task:

- The club hi-vis tops can be found draped on the air dryer, on hangers (where they should be), or crumpled up in some random places!
- Please round them all up and take away for a good wash in your machine at home.
- As hi-vis tops are in regular use, please return them to the club straightaway – they can continue air drying at the club.
- For any damaged hi-vis tops or any other worn out textiles you find, please take them away for textiles recycling at the local council tip.

How many are needed to help here:

1 person – or 2 for the company and extra pair of hands

What to do next:



How-to: Launder 'boat towels'

What's involved in this task:

- Typically found draped over boats and the air dryer, please round up all the towels used for cleaning boats and take away for a good wash in your machine at home!
- If you happen to have any old (but intact) towels you're happy to donate, these will be gratefully received.
- As 'boat towels' are in regular use, please return them to the club straightaway they can continue air drying at the club.
- If you notice any broken buckets and/or sponges, or there don't appear to be enough, please either donate any that you have going spare or pop to a local hardware store, remembering to <u>reclaim any</u> <u>expenses incurred here</u>.

How many are needed to help here:

1 person – or 2 for the company and extra pair of hands

What to do next:



How-to: Launder unclaimed/lost kit

What's involved in this task:

- Round up any/all kit that is lying around and take away for a good wash in your machine at home!
- Bring back the kit for display in the clubroom or books on the balcony.
- If, after 3 to 4 weeks, no-one has claimed this kit, please setup a
 pop-up kit shop or take away for donating to charity:
 - Set up in the clubroom: a foldable table, chairs, price list/tags, cash box, and card reader (optional).
 - All unclaimed kit and any kit samples can be displayed for sale at heavily discounted prices, or eventually donated to charity.

How many are needed to help here:

1 to 2 people

What to do next:



How-to: Sweep down steps and pontoon

What's involved in this task:

- Remove any obstructions or bin any large debris spare water bottles or other kit can be left in the 'lost property' crate.
- Grab a broom and dampen it using river water before sweeping it down, working your way from the top to bottom step – you'll be getting in your steps for the day!
- Collect and dispose of excess dust using a dust pan and brush.

How many are needed to help here:

1 person – or 2 for the company and extra pair of hands

What to do next:



How-to: Tidy up and sweep out boathouse bays

What's involved in this task:

- There are 4 bays, three of which are laid to concrete all the bay doors will be open.
- Remove any obstructions or bin any large debris from the floor and sides of each bay.
- Grab a broom and ask for anyone in the bay you pick to move out temporarily.
- Lightly dampen the concrete before sweeping it down, working your way from the back of the boathouse to the front.
- Collect and dispose of excess dust using the vacuum cleaner or dust pan and brush – whichever is preferred, just ask from where to locate either.
- You might want to wear a face mask to prevent inhaling dust.

How many are needed to help here:

1 person per bay

What to do next:



How-to: Tidy up and sweep out a changing room

What's involved in this task:

- There are two changing rooms the ladies is under the clubroom; the men's at the far end of the path away from the boathouse.
- Whilst we do have regular cleaners, such high traffic areas need even more regular cleaning and the bins emptying.
- Tidy up the spare dry kit, towels, etc. and bin any large debris from the floor, corners and benches.
- Grab a broom and ask for anyone in the changing rooms to move out temporarily.
- Collect and dispose of excess dust using the vacuum cleaner or dust pan and brush – whichever is preferred, just ask from where to locate either.
- Please empty any full bins and replace with a new bin liner the bin bag will need to be taken away for disposal in domestic waste, please.

How many are needed to help here:

 1 person per changing room – or 2 for the company and extra pair of hands

How-to: Keep a log of...

What's involved in..

- <u>CoW holders only</u>: any rigging adjustments made should be logged at <u>bit.ly/WEYToRig</u>
- Ergo maintenance checks at bit.ly/WEYErgMaintenance

How-to: Keep tidy...

What's involved in this task:

- Counter-tops in clubroom and kitchen wiped down and kept clear including cupboards being free of clutter
- Dishwasher emptied and set to 'Eco' cycle as and when needed
- Balcony neatly stacked weights benches, free weights, etc. Clear of kit including taking home for washing kit that's left behind and can be left hanging to be reclaimed or resold in a <u>pop-up kit shop</u>
- **Kit store** please get in touch with kit@weybridgerowing.club
- Workbench also parts cupboard and shelving at the back of the boathouse kept clear and clutter-free
- **Changing rooms** usually taking away full rubbish bag or removing any towels or unclaimed kit for washing <u>see here for more info</u>

How-to: Take away full rubbish bags

What's involved in this task:

- Our island location precludes us from having the council refuse services, so we must ask members to help out here too, by taking away full bin bags for disposal with domestic waste.
- This task is really for everyone to be mindful to any bins getting full –
 and certainly not so full that we end up with a vermin or pest
 problem squirrels are not cute or welcome in this instance!
- For recycling, we have a bin for dry recyclables and two bins for compostable food waste - for now these need taking away for disposal in domestic recycling bins.

How-to: Coordinate our WRCjnr squads


What's involved in this task:

The make up of our junior squads will see recent Learn To Row graduates starting out with our Beginner squad, moving on to our Intermediate squad (incl. recreational rowers), usually according to age (J12 to J14), and later progressing to the Development squad, with potential to move to our top Performance squad, both of which are independent of age, but usually for J15+.

- The role of section coordination can be done by one person (and has been done this way for year), but the role is really best shared across a team of squad coordinators.
- To this end, all tasks across our junior squads are laid out <u>via this actions board</u> (also linked via the image below) this should help avoid duplication of effort, missing any key actions or activity, or any other miscommunication.

How many are needed to help here:

1 to 2 people per squad



How-to: Coordinate our Senior/Masters squads



What's involved in this task:

Coordinating the Senior/Masters squads is quite fluid so this 'how-to' isn't overly prescriptive. Note: all new or returning members will be added by the Membership Secretary to the 'WRC Coached Sessions' WhatsApp group.

For training sessions:
